Preserved Pension

Did you serve only long enough to qualify for a preserved pension? If so, remember that slip of paper you received all those years ago entitled "Statement of Preserved Pension on Discharge from The Royal Air Force". If you did, now is the time to dig it out so that you can be prepared to contact RAF Pensions in due course. The advice given by them is that "you should claim, (the pension) in writing, not more than 3 months prior to your 60th birthday." If you haven't contacted them since you were discharged and have lost the address it is no longer RAF Innsworth as there is now a joint services approach. The new address to contact is

Email from Pete Ince to Les G.

Many thanks for getting in contact again after all these years. Yes I would like to join the entry association and I have sent my £5 standing order away today. I have often (sometimes?) looked at the Halton Apprentice website but never made it somehow onto the 103rd Entry site; it was only after I saw Mick (Woodhouse) at the petrol station in Abingdon the other day that the idea to try and find it occurred to me. It came up so quickly that I felt such a duffer, given that I use a computer and the Internet so often now as part of my job.

Resume – Pete Ince (26) – Ed.

I don't know if it is the form for us to give potted histories of our careers and lives but I shall just in case. My life since Halton as follows:

My first posting was to Watton in Norfolk with Geoff Barber, Geoff Lace, Charlie Barratt (I think?), and Ray Matthews. From there, to Cyprus in 1969 on 56 Sqn Lightnings for 2½ years. After a brief visit to Sealand (I think Keith Nuttall was there at the time) I managed to escape to 111 Sqn Lightnings at Wattisham in 1972. After the Lightnings folded at Wattisham I had 3 years at Honington on the Buccaneer OCU where I married my wife Sandra (an Essex girl) in 1975. My first son Christopher was born in Bury St Edmunds in 1977 and we three went off to Laarbruch that year, where I worked on the Buccaneers, Jaguars, and Hunters; my second son Stephen was born at Wegberg in March 1980. On return to UK in September 1980, I was initially posted to Scampton where they didn't have a job for me to do, so I pulled some strings and we went off to Coltishall where I was the Electrical Trade Manager of 6 Sqn Jaguars until 1984. Leaving Scampton was the second of my three great escapes. Laarbruch again in 1984 where I was the electrical shift trade manager on 20 Sqn Tornados until 1987 whereupon I was posted to Brize Norton. I was there for 7 years as NCO IC Engineering Records (not as dull as it sounds) until I asked for a move; the best they could come up with was Lyneham. Sandra and the boys by this time had put down taproots in Carterton (the satellite town to Brize), so we kept the house and I commuted when I was on shift. Lyneham was a mixed bag for me, I disliked being a shift NCO on the dreaded 'B' Line (another non-job) and managed to escape yet again (the third) after another Flight Sergeant in Eng Ops died and I was asked to fill in. I did this for a year then ran Lyneham Eng Records to gap the post until the civil service took over the job. I then went on promotion to an organisation called JSJET in MoD

London, where I was one of the Job Analysts for the Joint Service Job Evaluation Team.

This was completely different and probably one of the most interesting jobs I ever had in the RAF, even so they still managed to send me down to the Falklands in 1997/98 for four months. It wasn't so bad though.

I left the RAF in February 2001, and went to work for a small company on the Culham Science Centre just south of Abingdon, where I am the Quality, Health & Safety, and Facilities Manager for Culham Electromagnetics and Lightning working 4 days a week (Mon to Thur).

These days I am pretty boring really, I stayed in the RAF for 38 years, stayed with the same wife, and stayed with the same football team (Chelsea). My sons have both grown up (only one so far has fled the nest but I'm working on the other), and I have recently learned to fly

light aircraft with the Brize Norton Flying Club (I started on gliders at Bicester a few years back) and gained my PPL in 2002.

I cannot say for definite at the moment whether I shall be attending the bash in November, but Stratford on Avon is not that far away so I am hopeful to see you in the near future.

The New E111 Certificate

Are you travelling to Europe this year? You are? Then make sure you have a copy of the New E111 Certificate. If yours was issued before 19th August 2004 then it is no longer valid.

The new E111 can be obtained from your local Post Office (if it hasn't been shut) or downloaded from the following net address www.dh.gov.uk/travellers. Remember though it still has to be stamped by the PO.

At the end of December this year a new form is being introduced called 'European Health Insurance Card' (EHIC), which can be pre-applied for on the back of the E111 application form.
